
* PRAYER OF INVOCATION (followed by the Lord's Prayer)

The Westminster Confession of Faith

(ch. 21.6. Religious Worship and the Sabbath Day)

Under the gospel neither prayer nor any other part of religious worship is tied to or made more acceptable by being performed in any particular place. God is to be worshiped everywhere in spirit and in truth; in private families daily; privately by individuals daily; and regularly in solemn public gatherings, which are not to be carelessly or willfully neglected or forsaken, since God calls us to join other believers in public worship.

New Testament reading — Colossians 3:1–4, 12–17, 23–24 (Pew Bible, p. 1253)

¹ If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. ³ For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. […]
